All the new furniture and equipment were bought through the efforts of the parishioners by holding many bazaars and church dinners.

“Apple Crunch”


Holy Cross students will help celebrate National Farm to School Month by crunching into locally and regionally grown apples at 11:00 a.m on Thursday, October 12.
